

Identifying Neighbors & Stakeholders



The Church Body & Direct Property Users

Church members and staff, renters, service programs, and others regularly using the church property



Immediate Neighbors

Homeowners and renters, businesses, organizations, and property owners directly adjacent to the church property



Living in the Neighborhood

Homeowners and renters; housing developers and property management companies



Working / Studying / Worshipping

Employees, students, and parishioners; local business owners, major employers, cultural, educational, and religious institutions



Visiting / Recreating / Commuting

Visitors and commuters passing through the neighborhood; destinations such as parks and commercial centers; transit routes/stops/stations, trails, and high-volume roadways



Civic Groups / City Representatives

Community organizations, elected officials, non-profits, and other groups at the neighborhood, district, or city level that may have shared interests in the health of the neighborhood
