



- Total Width w/o Sidewalks & Planting Strip: 78'

Overall Site Conditions

- Suburban development pattern with a mix of residential and commercial properties
- North Avenue (US Route 6) Minor Arterial
 - Active Transportation Corridor high priority for sidewalk retrofit and cycle infrastructure to East and West per 2023 Pedestrian & Bicycle Plan
 - Represented on High Injury Network
 - Proximity to 7 schools, Colorado Mesa University, regional park, and VA hospital

Overall Site Conditions

- 29 Road Principal Arterial
 - Planned to connect from I-70 to US-50 at new interchange within ~8 years
 - Active Transportation Corridor high priority for sidewalk retrofit and cycle infrastructure to the south; medium priority for sidewalk retrofit to the north
 - Elevated crossing of I-70B; 1st railroad & river crossing east of Downtown
 - Proximity to 4 schools and a planned regional park




 Preliminary Speed Study indicates significant number of automobiles traveling at fatal speeds
